**The Call for the Annual Meeting
The White Plains Presbyterian Church
Sunday, February 5, 2012**

The annual meeting is called for Sunday, February 5 at 11:15 a.m. in the Church Sanctuary immediately following the morning worship service for the following purposes:

1. Election of Officers

Elders Four (4) for the class of 2015
(3 year terms)

Deacons One (1) for the class of 2013 (1 year term)
Five (5) for the class of 2015 (3 year term)

2. To elect the Congregational Nominating Committee of five members to report in February 2013

3. To elect the Ruling Elders as Trustees

4. To present the 2012 budget as approved by the Session

5. To approve the terms of call for the Rev. J. Geary

6. To elect the auditors for 2012.

7. To accept the end-of-the-year Financial Report for 2012

The Belhar Confession emerged from South Africa as a witness of Christian faith against the sins of racism and focuses on major themes of unity, reconciliation, and justice in the context of the church's Trinitarian belief. It calls the church to a deeper appreciation of the values of unity in diversity in relation to the divisions of race, culture and other facets of the human condition.

We believe ... that unity is, therefore, both a gift and a obligation for the church of Jesus Christ; that through

the working of God's Spirit it is a binding force, yet simultaneously a reality which must be earnestly pursued and sought: one which the people of God must continually be built up to attain; ... that the variety of spiritual gifts, opportunities, backgrounds, convictions, as well as the various languages and cultures, are by virtue of the reconciliation in Christ, opportunities for mutual service and enrichment within the one visible people of God;

Beginning February 26 join us at 11:15 a.m. each Sunday during Lent for this challenging exploration of a Christian faith for our times.

A Thought to Ponder

On New Year's Day this year, our young adults and youth led us in a worship service that revolved around a hymn by Brian Wren, entitled "Great Holy One." Worship included readings and songs around this theme, with the congregation invited to respond in song:

Great Holy One,
Spreading time and space
Show us who you are
In a human face.

Hide and seek:
Learn to trust,
No one's really ever lost.
Hide and seek:
When we're found
We'll be safe on holy ground.

It was moving to begin the new year with worship led by our young adults, and affirm with them that no matter where life may take them, they are never lost, but are ever sought and being found by the Holy One, who will sustain and guide them.

Looking ahead to the coming month, our youth group will have the opportunity to serve at the annual Kingsley House Valentine's party on February 10. They will also help fight hunger

locally through the " 'Souper' Bowl of Caring" project. Youth will make and serve a delicious soup during coffee hour on February 12 and funds raised will be given to local hunger programs. (We defer this project to the week following the Super Bowl because of our congregational meeting on February 5.)

Lent begins at the end of February, and while our Adult Education program will study the Belhar Confession, we plan to have concurrent programs for children and youth. Children up to third grade will work on various arts and crafts projects, while students in fifth grade through young adult will be invited to help me create a set of banners depicting the history of God's relationship with God's people described in Scripture, from creation through resurrection and the new creation. For this project, we will use the motif of the tree, a symbol that recurs throughout Scripture.

(Based on Bible Reading from Matthew 7:1-5 – Judging Others)

Most of the time, it is so easy to pinpoint and zero-in on the perceived flaws, mistakes and shortcomings of others; dwelling on it, ruminating on those thoughts, until it manifests into something our loving God would not approve.

Until you walk in their shoes, live their life, experience the pain, the joy, the frustrations of their existence, you cannot and should not utter a judgmental word toward another. No one but God adeptly understands the real circumstances and struggles behind an individual's actions.

Maybe there's something deliciously enticing about judging others that makes us feel better about ourselves and maybe even flawless in comparison to the terribly imperfect other.

Next time we are tempted to judge remember this:
